WINTER & MAILBOXES

Shake your mailbox – is it winter ready?

Kindly check the condition of your mailbox before winter sets in. Make sure the post is secure, the box is properly attached, and the box is in good shape with a secure door. Our snowplow drivers take precautions to avoid



striking mailboxes with their plows. Often, just the weight of the heavy snow can be enough to snap a poorly maintained post or crush a plastic or light metal mailbox. Please note that Pennsylvania law views mailboxes as an encroachment in the public way, put there at the owner's risk, and municipalities are not legally liable for any damage or repairs to mailboxes due to plowing operations. If you have an expensive mailbox, consider replacing it during the winter months with a less expensive one.
