1. It honors the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military.
2. Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day.
3. It became a federal holiday in 1971.
4. Originally, Memorial Day honored only those lost in the Civil War, but that changed during World War I.

Grilling Safety

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors
- Grills should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and hanging branches
- Keep children and pets at least 3 feet away from the grill area
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grill and trays below the grill
- NEVER leave your grill unattended
- ALWAYS make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it
